

If your Working Class Cat goes missing

Sometimes Working Class Cats may go missing, or seem to go missing. The cat may simply be wandering, becoming acclimated with your block or neighbourhood, or may have found a second person to provide food. That is normal behaviour for an outdoor cat, so continue putting out fresh food at the same time of day, every day. If your Working Class Cat does not return for several days, below are additional tips to get the word out and help her find her way back home.

1. If you have something like a very tall fence or a roll-up garage door, leave a door cracked open with food nearby so the cat learns/remembers where to enter & exit.
2. If you have some, sprinkle the cat's used litter around the areas where the cat may come & go from your yard. All cats know the smell of their litter!
3. Post on a neighbourhood community Facebook page. You can simply post a photo of the cat, state that the cat is new to the area, and to contact you if the cat is seen.
4. Ask your neighbours directly if they've seen (or are feeding) the cat. This should include your block and any blocks your location connects to.
5. Post flyers for anyone who isn't on the local Facebook community pages. Again, simple is key. A photo of the cat, a very short description (i.e. short hair brown tabby, left ear is tipped), and to call you if seen.
6. If the cat is spotted, call us! We will loan you a humane trap to bring her back "home."
